

### **Legal Entitlement to Birth and Death Records**

## Who may purchase a certified copy of a Louisiana Birth Certificate:

#### Yourself:

• Registrant (person named on the certificate)

### **Immediate Family:**

- Current legal spouse of person named on the certificate
- **Brother** or **sister** of person named on the certificate
- Mother or father of person named on the certificate
- Grandchild of person named on the certificate
- **Grandparent** of person named on the certificate
- Legal Guardian of person named on the certificate\*

\*Legal guardian must provide a **judgment of custody**. Custody by mandate or provisional custody from a notary will not be accepted. Transfer of custody witnessed by a notary will not be accepted.

# Who may purchase a certified copy of a Louisiana Death Certificate:

- Immediate Family (listed above)
- Beneficiaries with copy of insurance policy naming person applying for certified copy of the Death Certificate
- Last Will and Testament naming person applying for certified copy of the Death Certificate as a beneficiary
- Funeral Directors may request additional copies of a Death Certificate on behalf of surviving immediate family members within one year of the date of death.

A non-family member may request a certified copy of a certificate on behalf of an entitled individual with a letter of authorization that names the authorized individual and provides the person named on the certificate's name and date of birth. A copy of a state drivers' license or state ID for the entitled individual is required.

#### **Attorney Entitlement**

An attorney representing the person named on the certificate or representing any of the legally entitled individuals listed above is entitled to purchase a certified copy of a Louisiana Birth Certificate with a letter of representation on original letterhead. Attorney's bar roll number is required on the application.

Attorney's paralegal or runner may purchase a certified copy with a letter on original letterhead stating the case docket number, attorney's bar roll number, and the name of the person to whom the document is to be released.

LSA R.S. 40:61 a fine of not more than <u>ten thousand dollars</u> or imprisonment of not more than <u>five years</u> or both shall be imposed on any person who willfully and knowingly makes any false statement on any application for a certified copy of a vital record.
